MARCH 10, 1988

PURSUANT TO A SPECIAL CALL, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS IN AND FOR WASHINGTON COUNTY, FLORIDA, MET ON THE ABOVE DATE AT 5:00 P. M., IN THEIR REGULAR MEETING PLACE IN THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING IN CHIPLEY, FLORIDA, WITH COMMISSIONERS CARTER, CORBIN, HADDOCK, AND HAYES IN ATTENDANCE AND COMMISSIONER DAVIS IN ATTENDANCE SHORTLY AFTER THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY THE VICE-CHAIRMAN.

PRAYER WAS OFFERED BY ROGER D. HAGAN, BOARD ADMINISTRATOR.

AFTER MUCH DISCUSSION AMONG THE BOARD MEMBERS CONCERNING THE DAMAGE TO THE
COUNTY'S SECONDARY ROADS CAUSED BY THE EXCESSIVE RAINFALL AND THE ESTIMATED COST OF
APPROXIMATELY SIXTEEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$16,500.00) TO REPAIR A ROAD
AND BRIDGE DEPARTMENT MOTOR GRADER THAT SAID DEPARTMENT HAD NOT BEEN ABLE TO USE IN
REPAIRING SAID DAMAGED ROADS, COMMISSIONER CARTER OFFERED A MOTION, SECONDED BY
COMMISSIONER HADDOCK AND UNANIMOUSLY PASSED BY THE BOARD, TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY
SITUATION AND TO AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRMAN TO NEGOTIATE A TWO (2) YEAR LEASE-PURCHASE
FOR A MOTOR GRADER, EQUIVALENT IN SPECIFICATIONS TO THE LAST TWO (2) MOTOR GRADERS

COMMISSIONER CORBIN OFFERED A MOTION, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER CARTER AND UNANIMOUSLY PASSED BY THE BOARD, TO APPROVE A RESOLUTION, EXECUTED BY CHAIRMAN DAVIS ON MARCH 7, 1988, DECLARING A STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY EXISTING IN WASHINGTON COUNTY, FLORIDA, DUE TO EXCESSIVE RAINFALL ON MARCH 3RD AND 4TH, 1988, WHICH CAUSED SEVERE DAMAGE TO THE COUNTY'S SECONDARY TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM. SAID RESOLUTION WAS NECESSARY TO ENLIST THE AID OF THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION IN REPAIRING SAID TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS AT THIS TIME, THE MEETING ADJOURNED.
