COMMISSIONER STRICKLAND OFFERED A MOTION, SECONDED BY
COMMISSIONER ABBOTT AND CARRIED TO APPROVE MAY 17, 2012
MINUTES.

CHAIRMAN CARTER INTRODUCED LYNN BANNISTER WITH SENATOR
BILL NELSON'S OFFICE, WHO WILL SET UP IN THE HALL IN THE
CASE ANYONE HAD ANYTHING THEY WANTED TO DISCUSS WITH HER.
CHAIRMAN CARTER CLOSED THE REGULAR MEETING AND OPENED THE
PUBLIC HEARING.

III. PUBLIC HEARING - ROADWAY RIGHT-OF-WAY VACATION HAGERMAN'S ADDITION 40' PLATTED ROADWAY

MICHAEL DERUNTZ, WASHINGTON COUNTY SENIOR PLANNER

PROVIDED THE BOARD WITH A BRIEF HISTORY. MAX LANEY OWNS

PROPERTY THAT EXISTS IN HAGERMAN ADDITION. HE OWNS

PROPERTY ON BOTH SIDES OF THE 40 FOOT RIGHT-OF-WAY. MR.

LANEY REQUESTED THAT THE COUNTY VACATE THIS 40 FOOT

RIGHT-OF-WAY THROUGH BLOCK M. THE RIGHT-OF-WAY HAS NEVER

BEEN IMPROVED AND HAS BEEN DULY NOTICED AND FOLLOWING THE

LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE IN SECTION 10.03 AND ALL PROPER

NOTICE HAS BEEN GIVEN. THE PLANNING OFFICE HASN'T

RECEIVED ANY COMMENTS OBJECTING TO THE VACATION OF RIGHT
OF-WAY. THE PROPERTY HAS ADEQUATELY SERVED AND MET THE

LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE REQUIREMENTS FOR ACCESS FOR THAT

PROPERTY.

CHAIRMAN CARTER CLOSED THE PUBLIC HEARING AND REOPENED THE REGULAR MEETING.

COMMISSIONER ABBOTT OFFERED A MOTION, SECONDED BY
COMMISSIONER STRICKLAND AND CARRIED TO APPROVE THE
HAGERMAN VACATION RIGHT-OF-WAY.

COMMISSIONER STRICKLAND OFFERED A MOTION, SECONDED BY
COMMISSIONER ABBOTT AND CARRIED TO APPROVE THE CONSENT
AGENDA.

IV. DAVID CORBIN, PUBLIC SERVICES DIRECTOR

MR. CORBIN ASKED THE BOARD TO ACCEPT A COMMITTEE OF
HIMSELF, MR. JOYNER, MR. H.L. BROWN AND MR. RICKY CARTER
TO LOOK AT THE FEES IN THE PARKS SITUATION AS HE IS
HAVING A HARD TIME KEEPING UP WITH THE DEMANDS OF KEEPING
THE PARKS UP TO PAR BECAUSE FUNDS ARE DOWN.

COMMISSIONER ABBOTT OFFERED A MOTION, SECONDED BY
COMMISSIONER STRICKLAND AND CARRIED TO APPROVE OF THE
COMMITTEE.

V. NON AGENDA AUDIENCE

A. ANNETTE LANHAM - ADDRESSED THE BOARD TO PROVIDE THEM AN UPDATE ON THE WASHINGTON COUNTY CANNING CENTER. IT IS HER DESIRE TO SEE THE CANNING CENTER RE-OPENED AND SHE HAS RESEARCHED WHAT IT WOULD TAKE TO MAKE IT HAPPEN. THE

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CENTER WAS LAST OPENED IN 2009 UNDER THE AUSPICES OF TRICOUNTY COMMUNITY COUNCIL. RECENTLY SHE HAS MET WITH MR.

ANDREASEN AND MS. CORBUS OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY

EXTENSION OFFICE TO DISCUSS THE FEASIBILITY OF THE

CANNING CENTER FALLING UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE

EXTENSION OFFICE AND THEY SEEMED OPENED TO THE

POSSIBILITY.

MS. LANHAM REQUESTED THE COUNTY EARMARK \$5,000.00 FOR THE WASHINGTON COUNTY CANNING CENTER BE INCLUDED IN FY2013 BUDGET. SHE PLANS TO SEEK ADDITIONAL FUNDING FROM CARYVILLE, CHIPLEY, EBRO AND WAUSAU.

COMMISSIONER ABBOTT ASKED MS. LANHAM ABOUT A PREVIOUS

ESTIMATE THAT HE WAS AWARE OF, WHICH WAS AROUND

\$4,000.00/\$5,000.00 TO REPLACE THE BOILER FROM ONE OF THE

MILITARY BASES IN PANAMA CITY.

MS. LANHAM RESPONDED THAT AFTER SOME CORRESPONDENCE WITH MS. LEE AND A VOLUNTEER AT THE NAVY LAB SHE FOUND OUT THAT HE UNDER ESTIMATED THE \$4,000.00/\$5,000.00 OF REPLACEMENT AND IT WOULD BE MORE AROUND THE LINES OF \$17,000.00/\$18,000.00 WHICH IS STILL A BETTER OPTION THAN \$37,000.00.

SHERIFF BOBBY HADDOCK EXPRESSED HIS INTEREST BECAUSE OF
THE JAIL. THEY HAVE BEEN RECENTLY GIVEN SOME PRODUCE.

IF THERE IS A FUTURE COMMITTEE PUT TOGETHER HE EXPRESSED
INTEREST IN THAT AS WELL. FOR THE CANNING CENTER TO BE
IN OPERATION IT WOULD RELIEVE THE KITCHEN AT THE JAIL
SOME, BECAUSE THEY AREN'T REALLY SET UP.

CHAIRMAN CARTER ASKED MS. LANHAM TO GO TO THE CITY OF

VERNON AND GET AN AGREEMENT WITH THEM THAT THEY WILL LET

HER MAINTAIN AND HAVE THE BUILDING. THE BOARD CAN'T

PROCEED ANY FURTHER UNTIL THAT AGREEMENT IS IN PLACE.

MS. LANHAM SAID THAT SHE IS WORKING ON THAT.

COMMISSIONER ABBOTT ASKED MS. LANHAM TO CONSIDER FURTHER ABOUT THE CANNING CENTER BEING AT ANOTHER LOCATION. MS. LANHAM SAID THERE ARE DIFFERENT FACILITIES THAT HAVE BEEN ALREADY OFFERED BUT THEY WILL TAKE A GREAT AMOUNT OF REHABILITATION.

CHAIRMAN CARTER ASKED MS. LANHAM TO HAVE A GOOD ESTIMATE OF WHAT THE TOTAL EXPENSES VERSUS THE SERVICES PROVIDED WHILE INCLUDING WHAT THE SHERIFF HAS MENTIONED AS FAR AS TRYING TO MAKE IT TO WHERE YOU ARE GOING TO BE ABLE TO COLLECT OR AT LEAST BREAK EVEN.

MS. LANHAM ADDRESSED THE BOARD THAT SHE BELIEVES THAT INFORMATION BUT IT WASN'T INCLUDED IN THE PACKET. THE ESTIMATES WERE BASED ON 2009 FIGURES.

B. SUSAN PARSONS - 51102 CHANCE ROAD, CHIPLEY FLORIDA
THANKED THE BOARD AND THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION
FOR THE ROAD REPAIR WHERE SHE LIVES.

SHE ADVISED THE BOARD THAT SHE HASN'T BEEN ABLE TO RECEIVE ANY ANIMAL CONTROL.

CHAIRMAN CARTER ASKED HER IF SHE HAD CALLED THE ANIMAL CONTROL AT THE COUNTY. MS. PARSONS SAID THAT SHE HAD AND THEY AREN'T ALLOWED TO COME OUT TO HER HOUSE BECAUSE SHE IS OUTSIDE CITY LIMITS. COMMISSIONER ABBOTT ADVISED HER THAT THE BOARD ISN'T THE CITY BUT WASHINGTON COUNTY AND THAT SHE HAS COME TO THE RIGHT PLACE.

MS. PARSONS HAS PREVIOUSLY CALLED THE CITY OF CHIPLEY AND THE SHERIFF DEPARTMENT.

CHAIRMAN CARTER ASKED MR. DAVID CORBIN TO COME UP AND GO
WITH MS. PARSONS TO HIS OFFICE BECAUSE HE IS IN CHARGE OF
ANIMAL CONTROL FOR THE COUNTY.

CHAIRMAN CARTER CALLED A 10 MINUTE RECESS.

CHAIRMAN CARTER CALLED THE MEETING BACK TO ORDER.

IV. COUNTY ENGINEER - MR. CLIFF KNAUER ADDRESSED THE BOARD IN REFERENCE TO THE RURAL WORKS PROGRAM.

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION IS TRYING TO PROMOTE THIS PROGRAM FOR SOME OF THE SMALLER COUNTIES THAT AREN'T IN A T.P.O., WHICH INCLUDES WASHINGTON COUNTY. IF D.O.T. HAS MONEY LEFT OVER FROM THEIR SAFETY PROGRAM OR ANY OTHER PROGRAMS THEY CAN USE IT TO PICK FROM SOME OF THE ROADS THAT HAVE BEEN SUBMITTED BY THE COUNTY. MR. KNAUER COMPOSED A LIST THAT INCLUDED PROJECTS FROM THE LOCAL MITIGATION STRATEGY PLAN, CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN AND RECOMMENDATIONS FROM PUBLIC WORKS. THE TOWN OF WAUSAU HAS PLANS TO ADOPT THEIR LIST NEXT THURSDAY. D.O.T IS ANXIOUS TO RECEIVE THE COUNTY'S LIST.

COMMISSIONER CARTER ASKED HOW MANY RESIDENTS ARE ON MILLER LANE. MR. KNAUER RESPONDED 42 AND THAT FIGURE WAS RECEIVED FROM 911. COMMISSIONER ABBOTT ASKED MR. KNAUER HOW MANY RESIDENTS ARE ON RAYS PLACE. MR. KNAUER SAID THAT THE THINKS THERE WERE 16.

MR. KNAUER ADDRESSED THE BOARD THAT THE LEAST AMOUNT OF HOMES ON THE TOP 6 IS 10. KANE MILL IS 1,667 FEET.

CHAIRMAN CARTER ASKED IF THAT WAS JUST A PORTION OF KANE MILL. MR. KNAUER ADDRESSED THE BOARD THAT IS THE PART THAT IS COUNTY MAINTAINED WHICH HE RECEIVED FROM PUBLIC WORKS. CHAIRMAN CARTER SAID THAT IS INCORRECT; KANE MILL IS MAINTAINED FROM 77 TO HARD LABOR AND THAT IS A LONG STRIP THROUGH THERE.

MR. KNAUER ADDRESSED THE BOARD THAT 911 SHOWS 13
RESIDENTS AND PUBLIC WORKS HAS 1,667 FEET. CHAIRMAN
CARTER SAID THE ENTIRE ROAD IS MAINTAINED.

MR. KNAUER ADDRESSED THE BOARD THAT HE IS SHOWING MILLER WITH 1,753 FEET WITH 48 RESIDENTS.

CHAIRMAN CARTER ASKED MR. KNAUER HOW WOULD HE GO ABOUT DOING RAY'S PLACE WITH THE RAILROAD BEING THERE AND HE DOESN'T BELIEVE IT CAN BE DONE UNDER \$100,000.00.

CHAIRMAN CARTER SUGGESTED MR. KNAUER MEET WITH MR. JOYNER AND THE PUBLIC WORKS SUPERVISOR. HE DOESN'T HAVE A PROBLEM WITH THE BOARD TENTATIVELY ADOPTING THE LIST AND THEY CAN LOOK AT THEIR SUGGESTIONS AFTER MEETING WITH MR. JOYNER AND THEN HE CAN SUBMIT IT CONTINGENT UPON IT GETTING CORRECTED.

MR. KNAUER ADDRESSED THE BOARD THAT SINCE WAUSAU HASN'T ADOPTED THEIR LIST THEY MAY HAVE SOME CHANGES ON THEIRS AS WELL.

COMMISSIONER ABBOTT OFFERED A MOTION, SECONDED BY

COMMISSIONER STRICKLAND AND CARRIED TO APPROVE THE LIST

CONTINGENT UPON ALL IMPROVEMENTS.

MR. KNAUER ADDRESSED THE BOARD IN REFERENCE TO CLAYTON ROAD CONTRACT. BIDS WERE TAKEN ON IT ABOUT A MONTH AGO.

ANDERSON COLUMBIA IS THE LOW BIDDER AT 1,055,000.00. THE CONSTRUCTION DOLLARS LINED UP FOR THE PRODUCT ARE \$930,000.00 THE PROJECT WAS OVER BUDGET AND THE BOARD HAD ASKED ABOUT MEETING WITH ANDERSON COLUMBIA TO SEE ABOUT FINDING SOME SAVINGS. HE BELIEVES THE BOARDS ACTION WAS TO AWARD TO ANDERSON COLUMBIA CONTINGENT ON GETTING IT WITHIN BUDGET.

ANDERSON COLUMBIA SUGGESTED SOME WAYS TO TRIM SOME

DOLLARS AND SOME OF THEIR IDEAS WERE ENTERTAINED AS WELL

AS OURS BY THEM. THEY HAVE A REVISED CONTRACT AMOUNT OF

\$964,868.10, WHICH IS ABOUT \$34,868 OVER THE CONSTRUCTION

FUNDS THAT ARE IN THE GRANT FROM DEPARTMENT OF

TRANSPORTATION.

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COMMISSIONER ABBOTT ASKED FOR CLARIFICATION OF THE NUMBERS ABOVE AS WELL AS WHAT THE STATE'S PORTION IS.

MR. KNAUER ADVISED HIM THAT THE STATE'S PORTION IS \$930,000.00.

INTERIM COUNTY MANAGER STEVE JOYNER ADVISED THE BOARD

THAT THERE IS \$142,397.00 IN IMPACT FUNDS WHICH CAN BE

APPLIED TOWARD NEW CONSTRUCTION. HE ADDRESSED MR. KNAUER

ABOUT AN ESTIMATE THAT HE HAD ABOUT ACQUIRING SURVEYS AND

RIGHT-OF-WAYS ON HOUSTON, LUCAS, GREENHEAD AND ROCHE

ROAD. MR. KNAUER SAID THE FIGURE IS \$95,000.00 TO DO THE

BOUNDARY WORK, LEGAL DESCRIPTIONS AND THE SURVEYS SO THAT

RIGHT-OF-WAYS CAN BE RECEIVED ON THOSE 4 ROADS.

INTERIM COUNTY MANAGER JOYNER ASKED THE BOARDS APPROVAL

TO USE IMPACT FEE MONEY ON THE SHORTAGE ON CLAYTON AND

FOR HOUSTON, LUCAS, GREENHEAD AND ROCHE ROADS AS

MENTIONED ABOVE. IF THE IMPACT MONEY ISN'T USED IN A

CERTAIN TIME FRAME IT HAS TO BE TURNED BACK.

MR. KNAUER ADDRESSED THE BOARD THAT 1 OF THE CHALLENGES
THAT IS BEING FACED ON CLAYTON ROAD IS BECAUSE S.C.O.P.
NOW ALLOWS FOR NEW ROAD CONSTRUCTION THERE IS A REAL
CHALLENGE DOING THE SURVEY, DESIGN, RIGHT-OF-WAY
ACQUISITION, ALL OF THE UTILITY RELOCATION DESIGN AND ALL
OF THE CONSTRUCTION WITHIN A 1 YEAR TIME FRAME, WHICH IS

WHAT D.O.T. IS ALLOWING ON THEIR PROJECTS. THE BOARD IS

GOING TO BE IN THE SAME SITUATION ON ROCHE AND LUCAS LAKE

ROAD. IT SEEMS LIKE IF THE BOARD COULD GET AHEAD ON

ACQUIRING RIGHT-OF-WAY ON THE PROJECTS IT WILL MAKE A BIG

DIFFERENCE ONCE D.O.T. GIVES THE NOTICE TO PROCEED.

COMMISSIONER ABBOTT OFFERED A MOTION, SECONDED BY

COMMISSIONER STRICKLAND AND CARRIED TO USE THE FUNDS FROM

IMPACT FEES FOR THE \$34,868.10 ON CLAYTON ROAD AND

\$95,000.00 FOR SURVEYS AND RIGHT-OF-WAYS FOR HOUSTON,

LUCAS, GREENHEAD AND ROCHE ROADS.

CHAIRMAN CARTER EXPRESSED HIS THANKS TO JOANNE HAYES AND STACEY WEBB FOR THEIR HELP IN OBTAINING THE RIGHT-OF-WAYS FOR CLAYTON ROAD.

COMMISSIONER ABBOTT THANKED COUNTY ENGINEER KNAUER FOR HIS ASSISTANCE AS WELL.

MR. KNAUER ADDRESSED THE BOARD THAT HE HAD RECENTLY MET
WITH JIM KAPINOS WITH D.O.T., AND DAN MINER WITH THE CITY
OF CHIPLEY IN REFERENCE TO SOME RESIDENTS WHO HAD SOME
FLOODING ISSUES A COUPLE OF WEEKS AGO. COMMISSIONER PATE
ATTENDED THE MEETING AS WELL AS SEVERAL OTHERS FROM THE
NEIGHBORHOOD. THE ISSUE IS THE DITCH THAT CUTS ACROSS
FROM THE JOHNSON POND OVER BY THE PARTS STORE UNDERNEATH

77 AND GOES THROUGH A NEIGHBORHOOD ON 5TH STREET. THE DISCUSSION THAT WAS HELD WITH D.O.T. WAS DUE TO THE HIGH PERCENTAGE OF IMPERVIOUS AREA IN THAT DRAINAGE BASIN.

WHAT IS HAPPENING IS THE FIRST FLUSH IS HITTING SO HARD AND FAST THAT A BUNCH OF HOUSES ARE FLOODED ON 5TH STREET.

ON 4TH STREET THERE'S A 60 INCH CULVERT THAT WAS PUT IN ABOUT 5 YEARS AGO. BETWEEN 4TH AND 5TH STREET ON SOUTH BOULEVARD THERE IS A 36. THERE IS A STRETCH OF 36 ON SOUTH BOULEVARD THAT IS RESTRICTING TO THE NEW 60 THAT IS ON THE CORNER BY THE CHURCH.

COMMISSIONER ABBOTT ASKED COUNTY ENGINEER KNAUER IF IT
WAS IN THE CITY. MR. KNAUER SAID IT IS. MR. KAPINOS
RECOMMENDED THE BOARD ASK THE D.O.T. SECRETARY FOR A
MODIFICATION TO THE PROJECT ON BRICKYARD ROAD, CURRENTLY
WITH C.W. ROBERTS TO SEE IF THEY CAN ADDRESS UPDATING
THAT CULVERT OR SEE IF THERE MIGHT BE SOME FUNDING
AVAILABLE TO SEE IF MORE WATER COULD BE PUSHED IN THE
JOHNSON POND. THE JOHNSON POND IS THE ONE THAT IS ALONG
THE EAST SIDE OF 77; ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THE PARTS
STORE. THE IDEA WOULD BE TO HAVE A CONTROL STRUCTURE
THAT WOULD SEND WATER FROM THE DITCH ONTO THE EAST SIDE
OF 77 INTO THE JOHNSON POND UNTIL IT REACHED A CERTAIN
LEVEL AND THEN IT WOULD DISCHARGE UNDERNEATH 77 AND COME

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THROUGH NEIGHBORHOOD. CURRENTLY ALL OF THE WATER IS COMING THROUGH THE NEIGHBORHOOD.

COMMISSIONER ABBOTT MENTIONED THAT IT ALSO AFFECTS

BRICKYARD ROAD WHERE THE MECHANIC SHOP AND MCDONALDS ARE

LOCATED. MR. KNAUER SAID THAT THE BOX THAT HE IS TALKING

ABOUT WOULD PROBABLY NOT FIX THAT SITUATION BECAUSE IT IS

PROBABLY A GOOD BIT DOWN STREAM FROM THAT BUT THE BOX

WOULD CERTAINLY HELP THE SITUATION ON 5TH STREET.

CHAIRMAN CARTER ASKED MR. KNAUER IF HE HAD A COMMITMENT FROM THE CITY. MR. KNAUER SAID THAT NOBODY HAS COMMITTED TO ANYTHING AND HE WAS JUST MENTIONING TO THE BOARD MR. KAPINOS' SUGGESTION. CHAIRMAN CARTER ASKED MR. KNAUER IF MR. MINER WAS GOING TO GET HIS COUNCIL TO DO ONE AS WELL. MR. KNAUER SAID THAT HE IS SURE THAT HE WOULD.

COMMISSIONER ABBOTT SAID THAT IS JUST FIXING PART OF THE PROBLEM AND HE WOULD LIKE TO FIX THE WHOLE PROBLEM AND ASKED WHAT WOULD IT TAKE TO FIX THE WHOLE PROBLEM AND IF IT HAD BEEN LOOKED INTO. MR. KNAUER SAID THAT THEY HAVE HAD A LONG DISCUSSION ABOUT THE WHOLE PROBLEM AND THAT IT STARTS AT THE TOP OF THE HILL. REGULATIONS HAVE CHANGED SINCE SOME OF THE BUSINESS' WERE BUILT, SUCH AS CHUCK WAGON. YOU WOULD HAVE TO ASK THOSE PEOPLE TO ALLOW STORM

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WATER TO BE PUT IN ON THEIR PROPERTY WHICH IS A PRETTY TOUGH SITUATION.

COMMISSIONER ABBOTT MENTIONED THAT THERE REALLY AREN'T

ANY DITCHES THAT RUN PARALLEL BEHIND MCDONALDS AND CHUCK WAGON. MOST OF THAT WHOLE ROAD DOESN'T HAVE ANY DITCHES IN IT. MR. KNAUER ADDRESSED THE BOARD THAT THE WHOLE ROAD IS ACTUALLY A RIVER THAT DISCHARGES FROM THE DENTIST/DR.'S OFFICE AND FROM THE GOODWILL.
