IV. DEBRIS PLAN RFP'S - CHAIRMAN BUSH ADVISED MR. HAGAN THAT
HE HAS SOME THINGS HE WOULD LIKE TO SEE CORRECTED
INCLUDING THE FOLLOWING: THE CORRECT UNITS OF MEASURE
ARE USED, SOME OF THE DESCRIPTIONS ON THE EQUIPMENT, ONE
ON QUALIFIED CONTRACTOR AND SOME OTHERS.

MR. HAGAN ASKED THE BOARD TO ADVERTISE ONCE ANY
CORRECTIONS ARE MADE AND IT IS WORKED THROUGH THE COUNTY
MANAGERS OFFICE.

HE ADVISED THE BOARD THE CONTRACTOR HAS TO BE QUALIFIED BY FEMA AND PROVIDE PROOF. THE HORSE POWER AND MEASUREMENT WAS DEVELOPED BY A CONTRACT WITH USING SOME FEDERAL MONEY AND DSI IS UNDER CONTRACT DEVELOPMENT. THE 10% ISN'T AN AUTOMATIC. THE COUNTY HAS TO HAVE THIS TO QUALIFY FOR THE 10% BUT FEMA HAS TO OFFER THE 10%. THIS TIES TO THE 10%. THERE WAS A PLAN THAT WAS ADOPTED DURING THE SPRING AND CARRYING THIS OUT IMPLEMENTS THE PLAN THAT HAS ALREADY BEEN ADOPTED BY THE BOARD.

THE BOARD HAS HAD A PRE-NEEDS CONTRACT FOR 8-9 YEARS BUT

IT HAS NEVER BEEN IMPLEMENTED. THIS PRE-NEEDS CONTRACT

IS IMPLEMENTED AT THE BOARDS DISCRETION. IT DOESN'T MAKE

THE BOARD PAY FOR ANYTHING OR USE ANYBODY. THE BOARD

DOESN'T HAVE TO USE A CONTRACTOR BUT IF YOU DO USE ONE IT

HAS TO BE THE ONE THAT IS LISTED IN THE CONTRACT.

WHICH IS THE REASON FOR MOVING FORWARD TRYING TO GET

RIGHT-OF-WAY. ACCORDING TO THE WORK PROGRAM NOW THEY

SHOW ROCHE ROAD FOR 2015 AND LUCAS LAKE ROAD FOR 2016.

MR. KNAUER ADVISED THE BOARD THAT ABOUT 3 YEARS AGO
THE SCOP PROGRAM CHANGED. IN THE PAST SCOP WAS ONLY
FOR WIDENING, RESURFACING AND DRAINAGE BUT IN 2010
THEY CHANGED IT SO THAT SCOP PROJECTS COULD BE USED
FOR NEW CONSTRUCTION OR IMPROVEMENTS. THE PROBLEM IS
THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION STILL GIVES YOU 1
YEAR FROM THE TIME YOU SIGN THAT AGREEMENT TO BE
COMPLETED WITH THE PROJECT WHICH IS ALMOST IMPOSSIBLE.
COUNTY MANAGER JOYNER ADVISED THE BOARD THAT HIMSELF,

COMMISSIONER ABBOTT AND ATTORNEY GOODMAN MET WITH THE

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION LAST WEEK AND HE PLANS TO

SET UP A MEETING IN REFERENCE TO WHY THE PROJECTS ARE BEING PUSHED BACK.

ATTORNEY GOODMAN ALSO ADVISED THE BOARD THAT BY REQUEST HE HAD DRAFTED A MEMORANDUM IN REFERENCE TO FILL DIRT.

ALSO ATTACHED IS THE FLORIDA ATTORNEY GENERAL ADVISORY

OPINION 82-18 AND A LETTER FROM A STATE ATTORNEY THAT HE HAD IN HIS FILES FROM A SIMILAR ISSUE IN LIBERTY COUNTY.

HE ALSO HAD A REQUEST FROM A COMMISSIONER TO LOOK AT THE STATUTE 112061 WITH RESPECT TO TRAVEL EXPENSES AND GAS MILEAGE. HE HASN'T WRITTEN A MEMORANDUM ON THAT BUT WILL DO SO IF THE BOARD WOULD LIKE HIM TO DO SO.

THERE WAS ALSO A REQUEST FROM ANOTHER COMMISSIONER IN REFERENCE TO PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE WITH THE ABILITY TO RESEND PREVIOUS MOTIONS AND HE DRAFTED AN E-MAIL DATED YESTERDAY THAT THE BOARD SHOULD HAVE.

ATTORNEY GOODMAN ADVISED THE BOARD THAT PRIOR TO 2011

THERE WAS LIMITATION IN 215425 WITH RESPECT TO GIVING

BONUS' FOR PERFORMANCE ALREADY DONE. HE ATTACHED SOME

ATTORNEY GENERAL OPINIONS BUT TO INFORM THE BOARD SECTION

215425 PROHIBITS EXTRA COMPENSATION AFTER SERVICES HAVE

> BEEN RENDERED. THE PURPOSE OF SAID PROVISION IS TO PREVENT PAYMENT IN THE NATURE OF GRATUITY FOR PAST SERVICES AND THE RESTRICTION PERTAINS TO EXTRA COMPENSATION GIVEN AFTER SERVICE IS PERFORMED NOT TO COMPENSATION EARNED DURING SERVICE. A RETROACTIVE PAYMENT FOR SOMEBODY IS PROHIBITED BY 215425. THERE WAS A PROVISION WHEN THEY ADDED THAT SECTION IN ABOUT 1992-THEY ADDED A SECTION TO CHAPTER 125 WHICH IS KIND OF THE STRUCTURE OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT IN FLORIDA. WHAT THEY ADDED IN 1992 TO 12501BB WAS NOT WITHSTANDING THE PROHIBITION AGAINST EXTRA COMPENSATION COUNTIES MAY PROVIDE FOR AN EXTRA COMPENSATION PROGRAM INCLUDING A LUMP SUM BONUS PROGRAM WHICH WILL REWARD OUTSTANDING EMPLOYEES WHOSE PERFORMANCE EXCEEDS STANDARDS. WHAT THEY DID WAS RESTRICT EXTRA COMPENSATION BUT SAID WE ARE GOING TO GIVE A PROVISION IN HERE TO COUNTIES WHERE BY WE ALLOW A LUMP SUM BONUS PROGRAM TO REWARD OUTSTANDING PERFORMANCE. IN 2011, IN THE LAST 18 MONTHS CHAPTER 2011143 WHICH HE SITES THE LEGISLATURE WENT IN AND COMPLETELY DELETED 12501BB. THEY AMENDED WHAT IS FLORIDA STATUTE 215425 TO GIVE A SPECIFIC GUIDE WITH RESPECT TO BONUS' FOR COUNTY EMPLOYEES. IT BASICALLY SAYS FOR IT TO BE DONE IT HAS TO BE FOR PROSPECTIVE NOT RETROACTIVE WORK. IF THERE IS A POLICY SET JANUARY 1, 2013 AND THE

BOARD SAID DECEMBER 2013 WE CAN PASS A RESOLUTION THAT
THE BOARD CAN GIVE A BONUS BASED ON THE WORK. THE

PERFORMANCE STANDARDS HAVE TO BE DESCRIBED, EVALUATION
PROCESS AND ALL EMPLOYEES HAVE TO BE NOTIFIED OF THE

RESOLUTION PRIOR TO THE EVALUATION PERIOD AND THEY HAVE
TO CONSIDER ALL EMPLOYEES FOR BONUS' SO YOU CAN'T BE

DISCRETIONARY. THAT IS HOW HE WOULD ADVISE DOING IT IF
THE BOARD DECIDES TO CREATE BONUS STRUCTURE GOING
FORWARD.

COMMISSIONER PATE ADDRESSED THE BOARD THAT WHATEVER THEY

DO THEY WILL HAVE TO COME UP WITH AN ORDINANCE STATING

HOW IT WILL BE DONE.

ATTORNEY GOODMAN ADVISED THE BOARD THAT IF YOU ARE GOING TO STRUCTURE SOMETHING AS A BONUS OR SOME SORT OF INCENTIVE BONUS THE BOARD NEEDS TO MAKE SURE TO COMPLY WITH THE NEW GUIDELINES THAT WERE PASSED ABOUT 18 MONTHS AGO IN 215425. WHAT IS INTERESTING OTHER THAN A BRIEF CITE THERE IN A 2011 ATTORNEY GENERALS OPINION THERE IS NO CASE LAW OR PRECEDENT OR INTERPRETATION OF THIS NEW STATUTE. HE RECOMMENDED THAT IF THE BOARD IS GOING TO SET A BONUS STRUCTURE IN THE FUTURE THAT THEY TASK EITHER STEVE OR HEATHER WITH MAKING SURE THAT IT COMPLIES WITH 215425.

COMMISSIONER BROCK OFFERED A MOTION TO GIVE EMPLOYEES A MARKET ADJUSTMENT OF \$200.00.

COMMISSIONER ABBOTT ASKED FOR CLARIFICATION IF HE WAS
TALKING ABOUT ALL BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONER EMPLOYEES,
THE CLERK, SHERIFF, ETC.

CLERK COOK ADDRESSED THE BOARD THAT SHE WASN'T THERE THE PREVIOUS WEEK WHEN THE SHERIFF SPOKE BUT ACTUALLY IF YOU WANT TO GET DOWN TO IT NO HER OFFICE, A PORTION OF IT IS FUNDED BY THE BOARD BUT AREN'T BOARD EMPLOYEES AND NEITHER ARE GILS, HELEN AND CAROL'S.

ALSO SPEAKING ON THE ISSUE OF BONUS WAS COMMISSIONER BUSH.

COUNTY MANAGER JOYNER ADVISED THE BOARD THAT THERE IS MONEY IN THE TAX DEED OVER BID.

CLERK COOK ADVISED THE BOARD THAT THE TAX DEED MONEY
ISN'T REOCCURRING. IT USED TO COME BACK TO THE COUNTY
BUT NOW WHEN THERE IS AN OVER BID THAT MONEY GOES TO THE

COMMISSIONER GOTHARD EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT FEMA BEING OVERSPENT. SHE WOULD LIKE ANSWERS BEFORE AGREEING TO SPEND \$340,000.00 ON MILLED ASPHALT.
