The Washington County Board of County Commissioners called a special emergency meeting on Friday, October 12, 2018 at 11:00 a.m., held at the Washington County Emergency Operations Center.

Call to Order – Chairman Hawkins

Commissioner Bush offered a motion, seconded by Commissioner Kent and carried to enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Cajun Navy to assist in the disaster relief efforts for Hurricane Michael.

The Cajun Navy is a volunteer group, which will be able to assist in accessing homes.

Commissioner Kent offered a motion, seconded by Commissioner Joyner and carried to enter into a debris monitoring and removal contract with Crowder Gulf.

Commissioner Bush offered a motion, seconded by Commissioner Kent and carried to authorize the chairman to negotiate down the list in the event one debris hauler and/or monitor could not perform or did not meet performance standards.

Commissioner Bush offered a motion, seconded by Commissioner Abbott and carried to authorize an unlimited spending authority to

County Administrator Massey upon approval by the chairman.

Commissioner Joyner offered a motion, seconded by Commissioner Kent and carried to activate Wheeler and Associate's contract to place them with public works crews. The contract is for the period of one-year.

Discussion was held regarding final debris disposal. Commissioner Bush stated if you could force air (burn on site), it was the cheapest way. County Administrator Massey confirmed the site met the requirements. No action was needed.

Points of distribution are being set up at Vernon, Chipley, and the Possum Palace with water, food, and MRE's.

Discussion was held regarding the opening of offices and utilizing employees in other areas until power is restored.

Commissioner Bush offered a motion, seconded by Commissioner Abbott and carried to give the human resource department the authority to coordinate employee schedules until normal operations resume.

Commissioner Abbott offered a motion, seconded by Commissioner Kent and carried to adjourn.

The Washington County Clerk's office was not in attendance due to limited communication caused by Hurricane Michael. The minutes have been prepared per notes received from the human resource department.
